2593 Pleasant View Road • Richmond, Indiana

- Listed on the National Register of Historic Places.
- Victorian, Second Empire style home built in 1876 for Abram & Agnes Gaar.
- The Gaars were one of the most influential families in Richmond history.
- Founders of Gaar-Scott and Company, the leading manufacturer of threshing machines and steam engines from 1842 to 1911.
